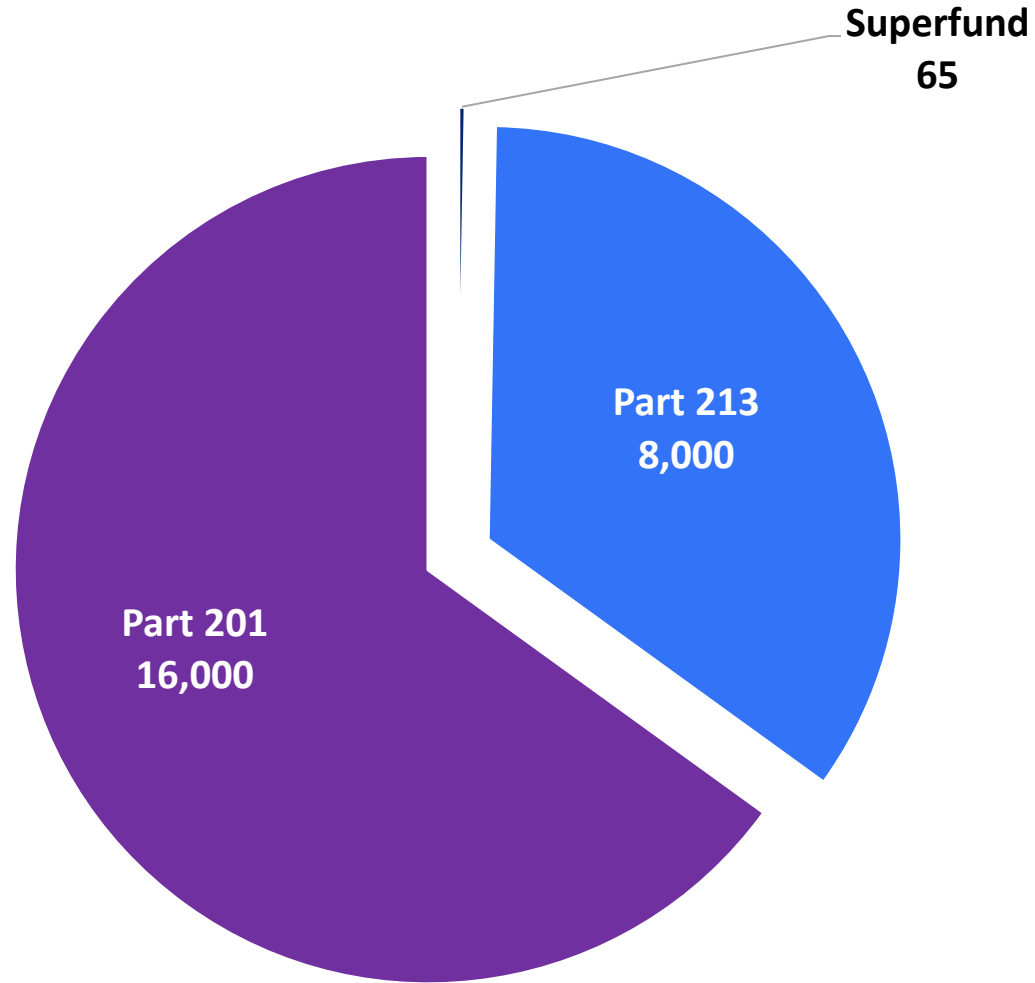

# Part 213 Leaking Underground Storage Tanks

- 8K+ open sites
- Majority are 20+ years old and most of these are no longer active UST facilities.
- Goal – 25% reduction in open sites by 2028
- Policy changes to remove obstacles
- 80% more closures but still need more

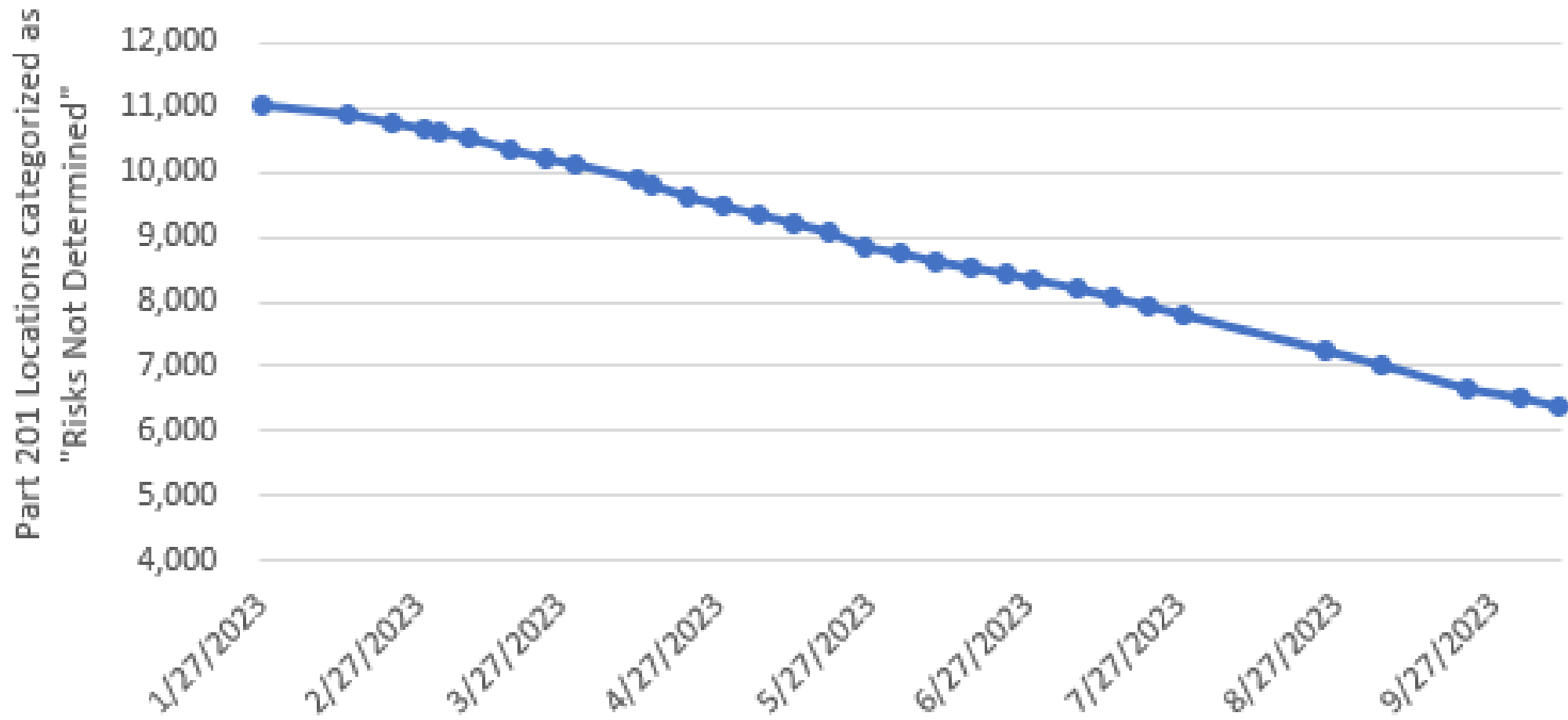


# Part 201 Contaminated Sites Challenges

- Limited data for site assessments
  - Many unknowns
  - Data base management
- Self implementing program
- Cost

# Information Management

- Electronic Document Management (aka Going Paperless)
  - 1.3 million documents since 1997
  - Now averaging 9000 documents per week
  - Converted 4,784,073 pages in FY2023
- FOIAs – 18K FOIA requests in last year
- Public Facing Documents in RIDE Database
  - Today over 1 million documents available to public

# Brownfield Redevelopment



- FY 2023 Metrics
  - \$31.3 million in incentives
  - 88 projects in 49 communities
  - ROI \$49 per \$1 spent
- Policy changes/updates
- MSHDA Support
  - 27 submittals fast tracked
  - Tech assist on 62 projects
