Air Quality Division 2022 Accomplishments

- Pre-construction permit actions = 570
- Renewable Operating permit actions = 45
- Inspections = 929
- Air Complaints Received and Resolved = 2,482
- Monitored outdoor air over 43 sites, with 100+ monitors
- Emission reports received from industry = 1,600+
- Asbestos removal notifications received = 69,176
- Asbestos inspections completed = 1,726
- Violation notices issued = 433
- Enforcement cases = 27
- Over 19,000 email list subscribers



- AQD models attainment, currently drafting redesignation State Implementation Plan(SIP)

Wayne County

- Federal Implementation Plan(FIP) Nov. 2022
- AQD submits SIP December 2022, incorp. FIP
- EPA conditional approval of SIP March 2023, stops sanctions


EPA Reconsideration Proposal:

Ensure identified states do not significantly contribute to problems attaining and maintaining the 2015 Ozone NAAQS in downwind states






