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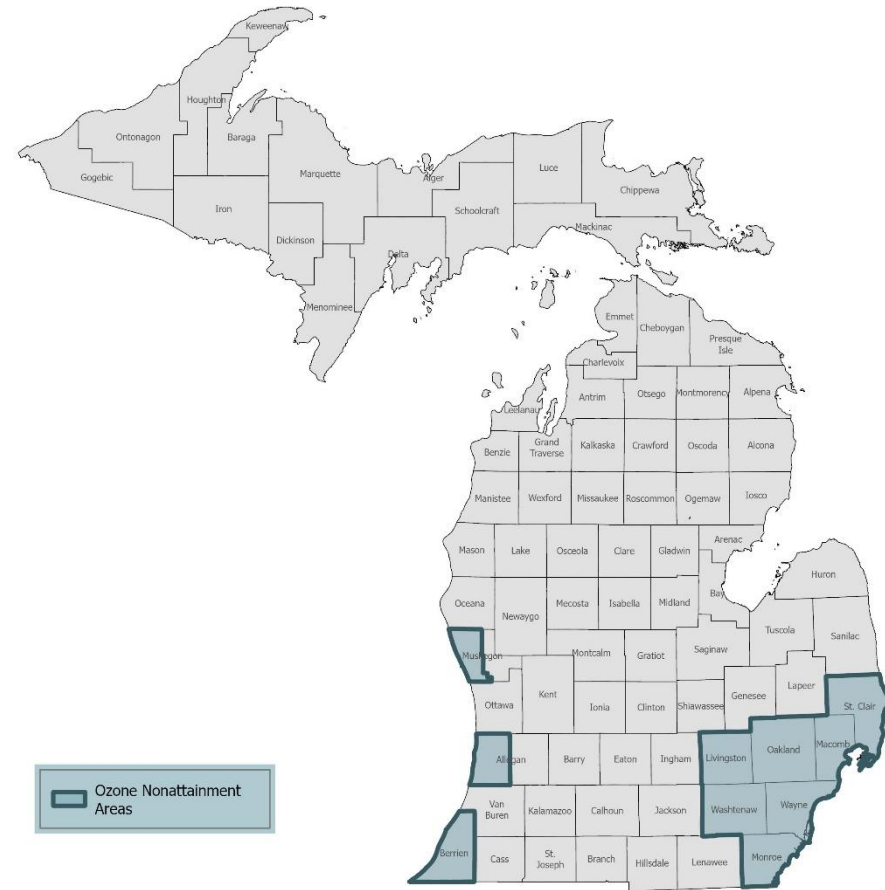

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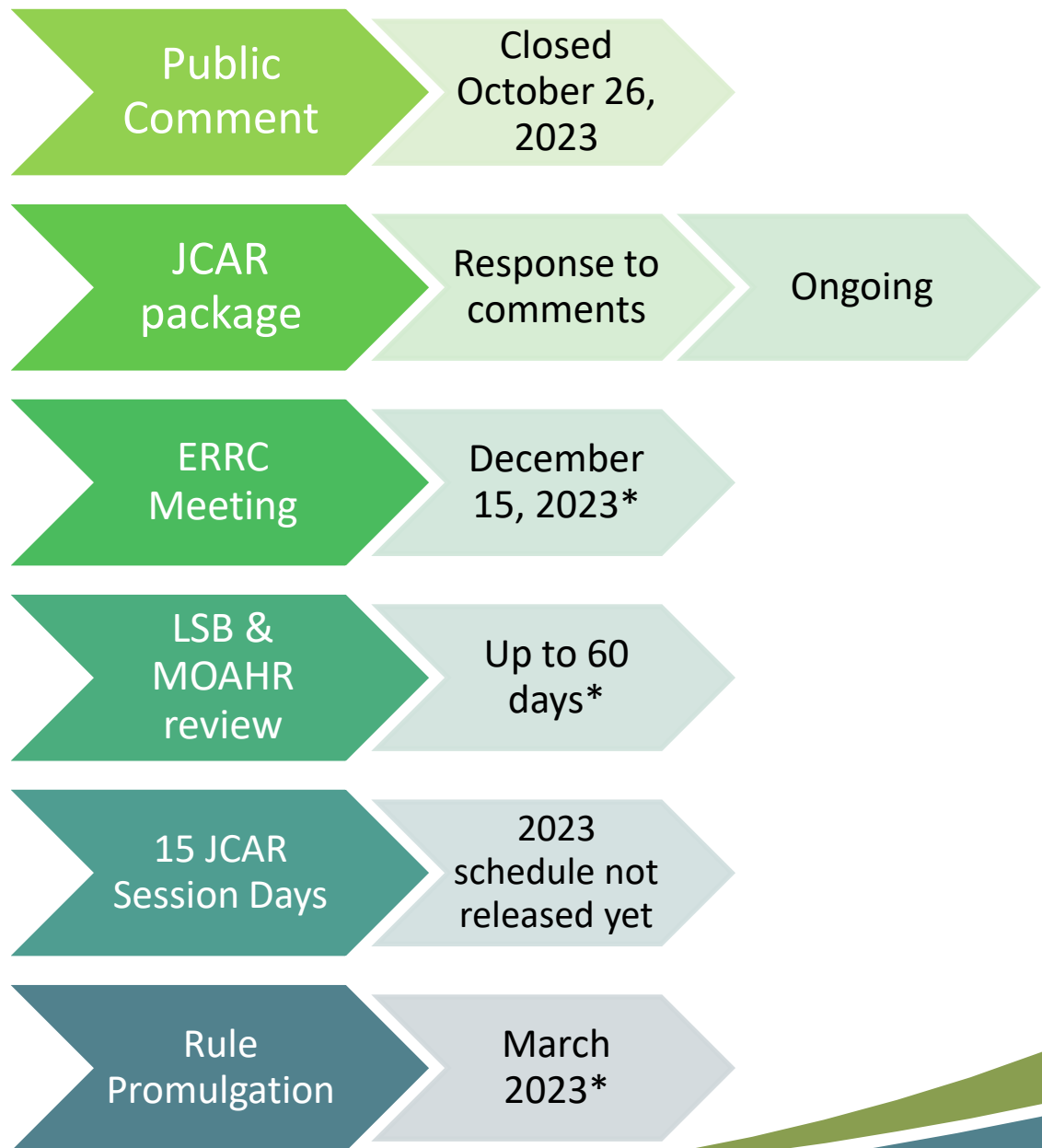
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Nonattainment status update

- Three west Michigan nonattainment areas have been bumped up from marginal to moderate (eff. Nov. 7th)
- The seven-county southeast Michigan area has not been bumped up to moderate...yet(?)
- In order to meet CAA required “reasonable further progress” (RFP) our VOC rules have to be effective for one (full) ozone season before Aug 2024 (i.e. March 2023)

Engines, boilers, turbines, process heaters, other large NOx sources

In the midst of drafting NOx RACT rules

As of now.... Draft rules apply only in NAA... at existing sources > 100 tpy PTE and all new units

Received some informal feedback from AQD and EPA Region 5 staff
Informal review by workgroup/stakeholders now

Next steps

Request for Rulemaking draft is ready – official start

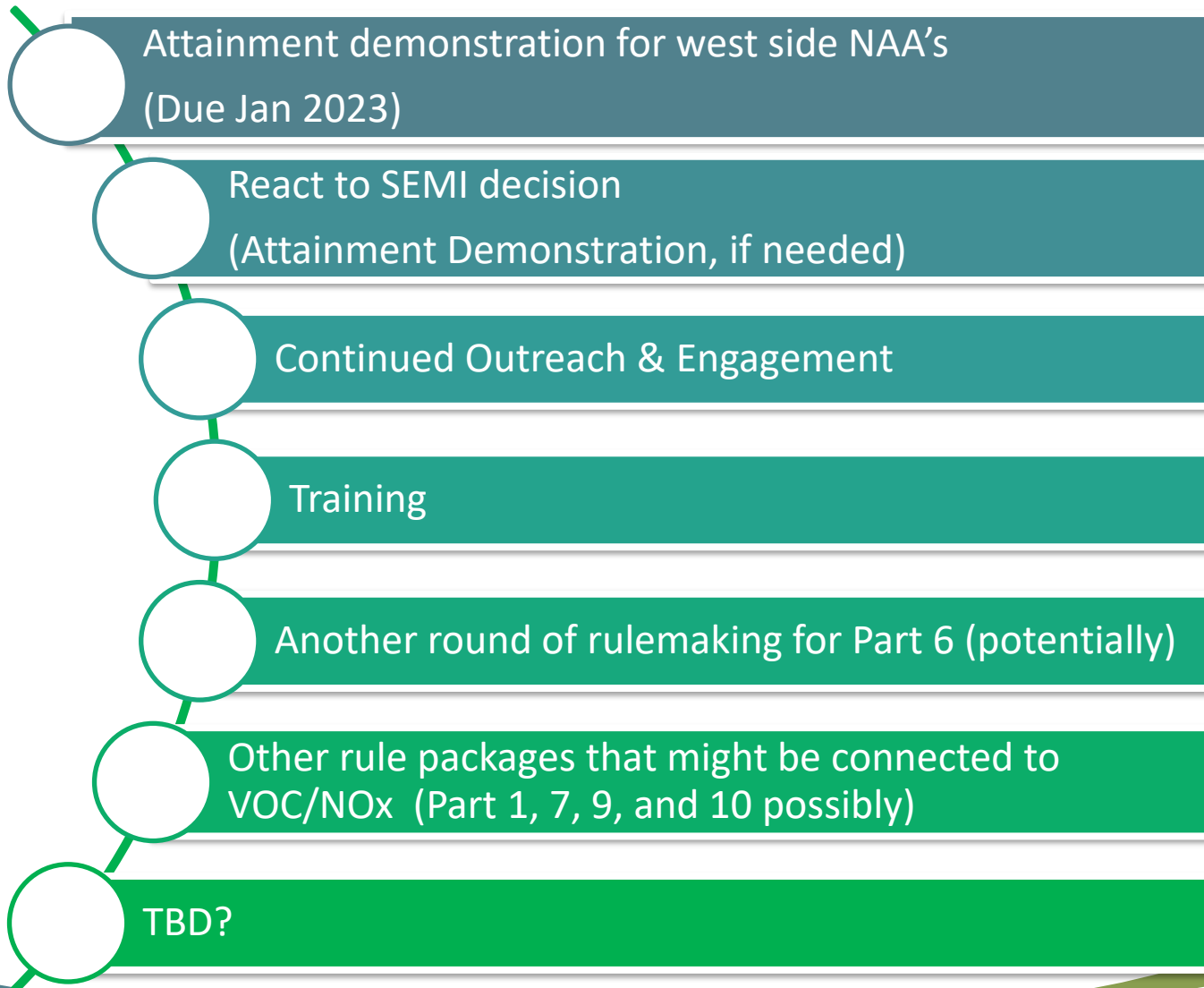
AQD management review
