- Ionia County meeting the National Ambient Air Quality Standard for Lead
- Accomplished Field initiative to inspect all significant sources of lead
- Completed 1500+ asbestos inspections
- Finalized air toxics rules for permitting (ORR)

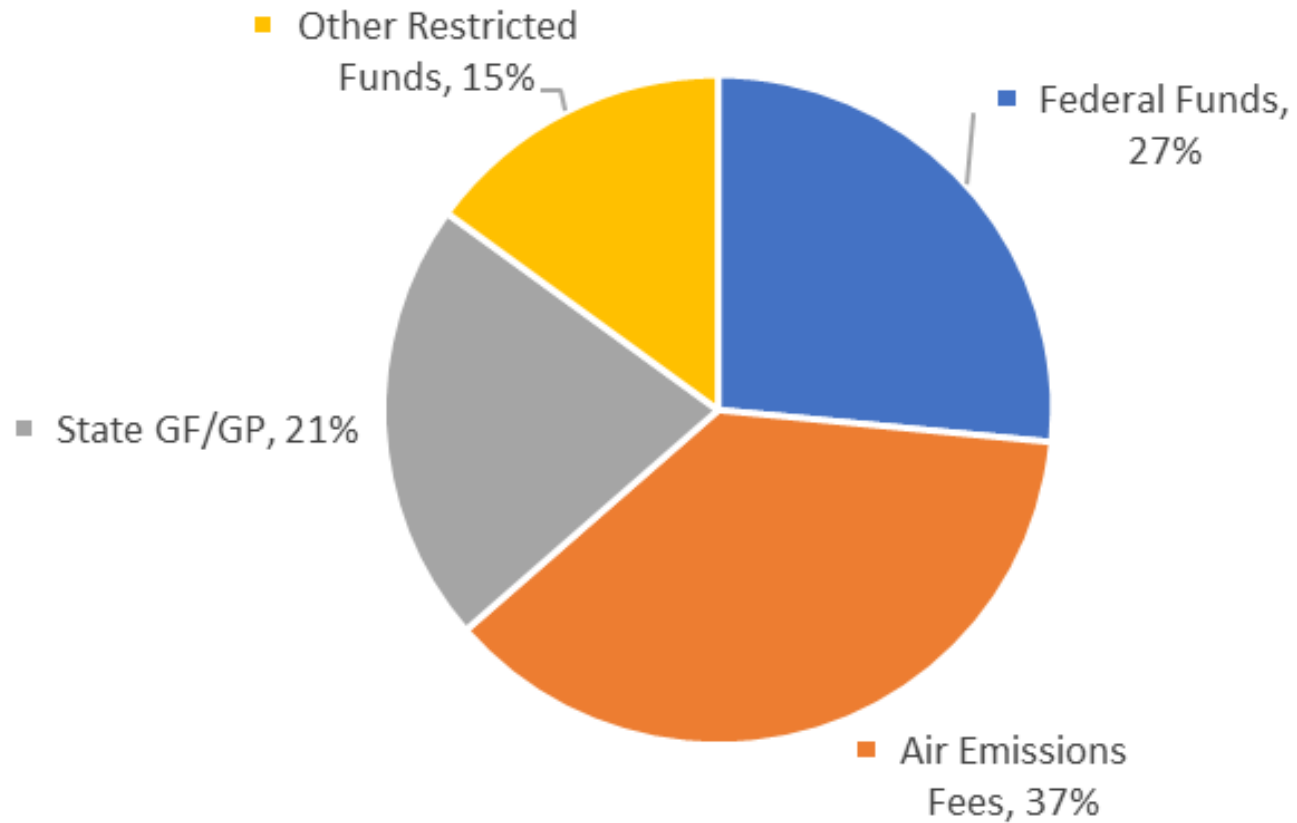
Built partnerships to address Michigan's environmental issues

- Involved in DEQ issues - vapor intrusion, PFCS, etc.

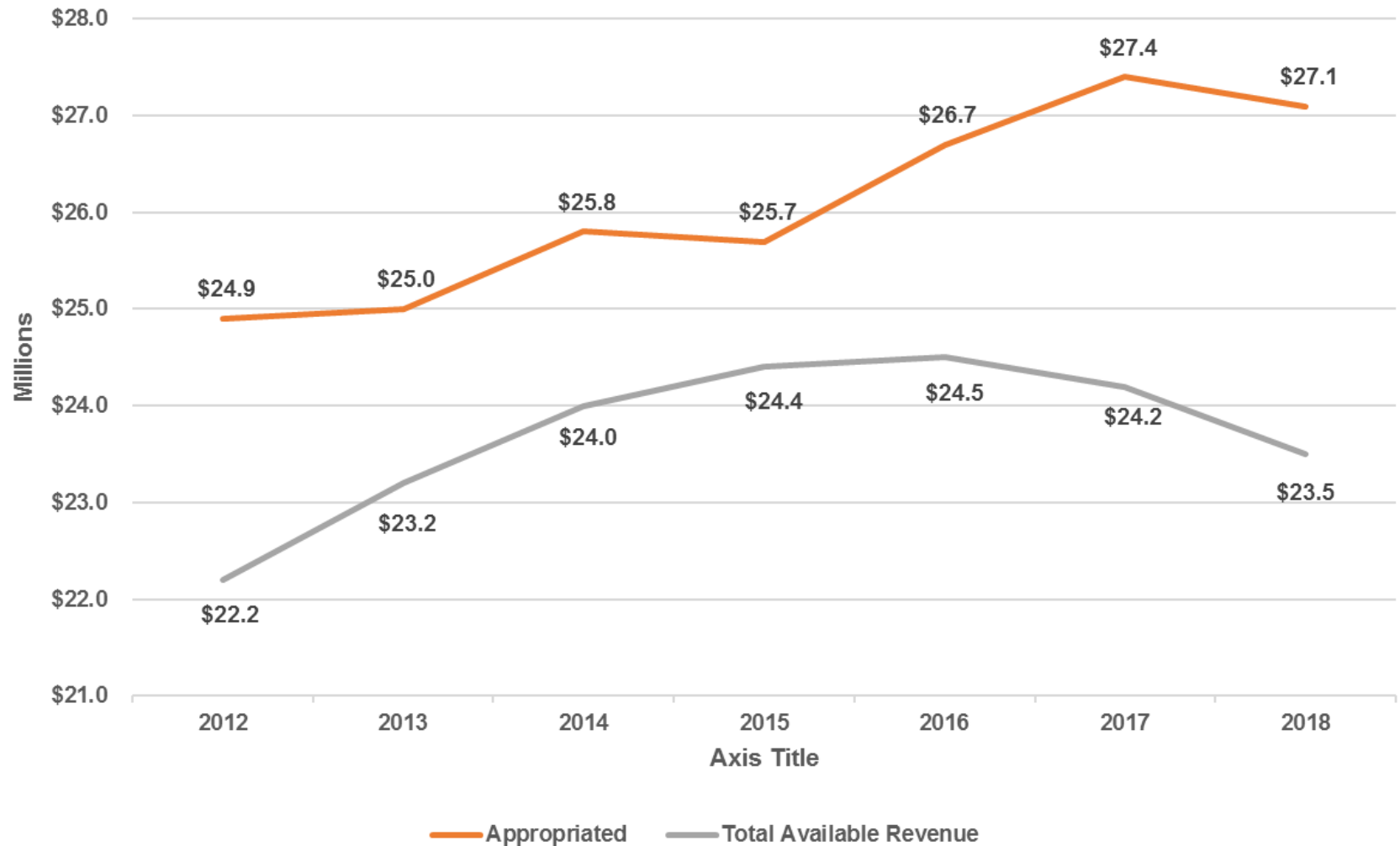
Met state and federal requirements

- Completed over 270 citizen inquiry investigations
- Continued to meet Governor's goal for permit to install timing
- Met all EPA air monitoring QA/QC specifications
- Timely submittals to EPA for ozone designations & rule revisions
- Met all state budget and accounting requirements
- Maintained level of effort despite declining revenues

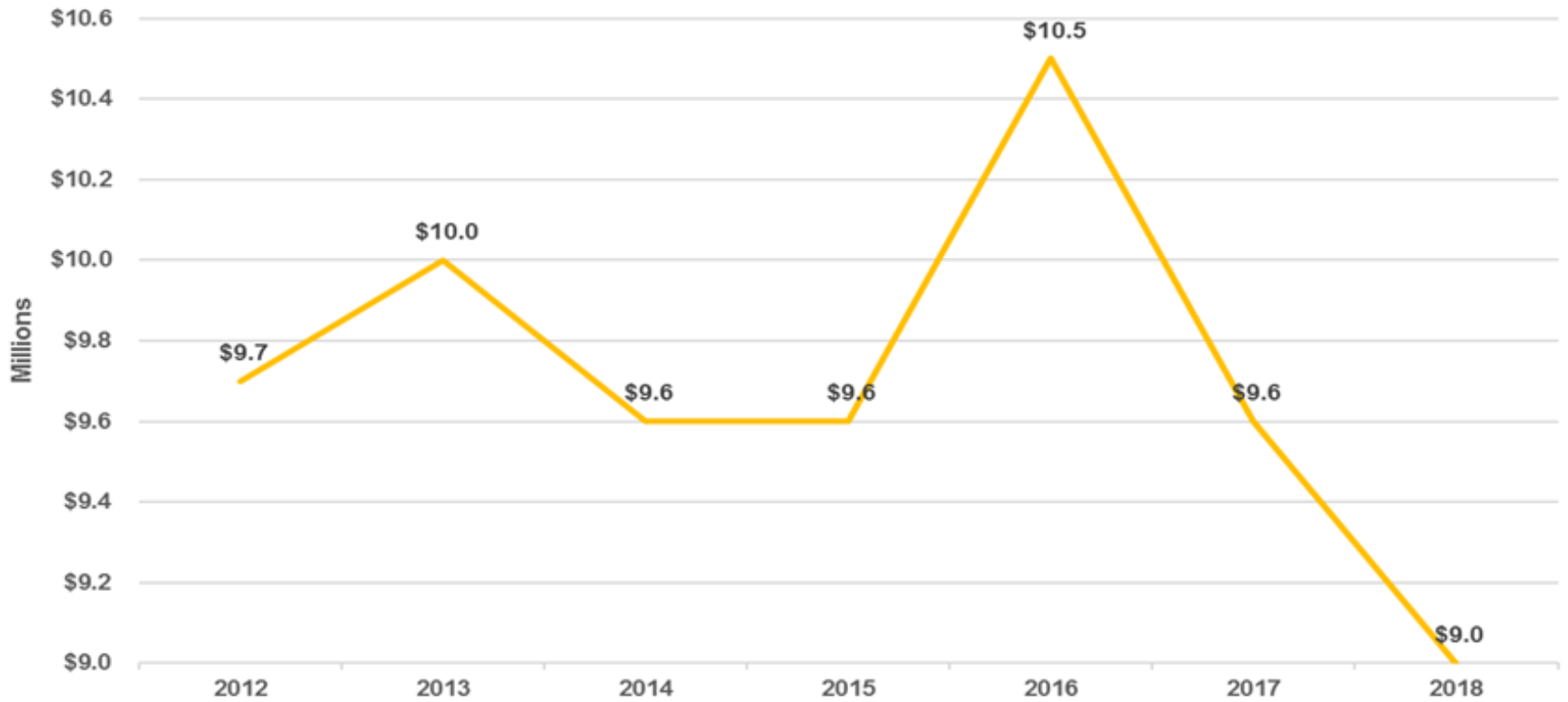
Fiscal Year 2018 AQD Appropriation

- Title V Fees – Sunset in Sept 2019
- Succession planning to address retirements
- Enjoy life – no more worrying all day/night about work

- Ensure demolition of structures comply with the asbestos National Emission Standard for Hazardous Air Pollutants
- Address areas not meeting the National Ambient Air Quality Standards - sulfur dioxide & ozone(?)
