- Power plant emissions Nox, co, voc, sox
- Emergency generator emissions Nox, co, voc, sox



Air Pollution Control Rules

State of Michigan

- Rule 201, Permit to Install
- Rule 901, Air contaminant or water vapor; prohibition.
- Rule 910, Air-cleaning devices.
- Rule 911, Malfunction abatement plans.

- 40 CFR part 60 subpart JJJJ SI RICE







Per Capita Revenues per State, Per Number of Retail Years











Shrinking Green



- Legalization in U.S. and Canada has not eliminated black market.
- California 2019 marijuana sales:*
 - Legal Marijuana Sales \$3.1 billion
 - Illegal Marijuana Sales \$8.7 billion
 - 75% of legal sales lost to the black market
- Canada 2019 marijuana sales:†
 - 45% to 75% of legal sales lost to the black market

- 75% of legal sales lost to the black market in Michigan.*
- Marijuana Stocks Drop 60 to 70% Nationwide
- California Marijuana Industry Layoffs
- Potential Bankruptcy
- Abandoned Properties
- Increase Illegal Grow Impacts
- Loss of State Revenues


